About Operation Santa Claus (OSC)

OSC is an annual charity campaign established jointly by the Post and RTHK in 1988. It is dedicated to cultivating a spirit of giving, love and care throughout Hong Kong. SCMP Charities Limited – an independent charity registered under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance – was set up in 2004 to ensure OSC's continuing success. We manage all donations with transparency and accountability and adhere to good corporate governance practices.

The campaign has grown from its modest beginnings to become one of Hong Kong's most recognised charity events. We continue to build upon a network of thousands of corporate, school and supporter resource channels, as well as over 300 active local charitable community partners, to encourage the development of collaborative philanthropic communities across Hong Kong. OSC reports to the Post's general counsel and company secretary.

So far, we have raised over HK\$396 million and supported 364 charitable projects that have had an impact on the lives of more than 100,000 people. By connecting compassionate organisations and individuals with impactful charitable projects, OSC unlocks the city's spirit of giving and builds upon its legacy to create a brighter future for all.

Our unique position allows us to forge autonomous, niche partnerships with the city's small, underserved local registered charities. We are uniquely positioned to streamline support to – and empower – these vital community organisations. We also serve as a vital bridge and platform, pooling financial resources, volunteer support, in-kind donations, and media exposure from thousands of supporters and diverse resource channels to sustainably empower these communities.

We engage individuals, corporations, clubs, associations, and schools across Hong Kong through OSC and various creative fundraising activities, such as charity runs and galas. Participation helps spread joy throughout 2025 and beyond – continuing to bring hope to those most in need

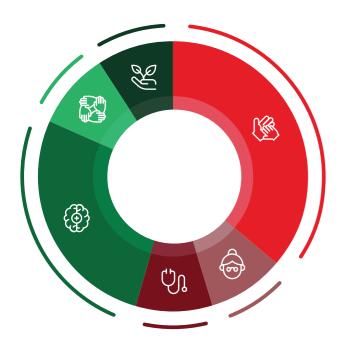

OSC Everyday Heroes Celebration Nights



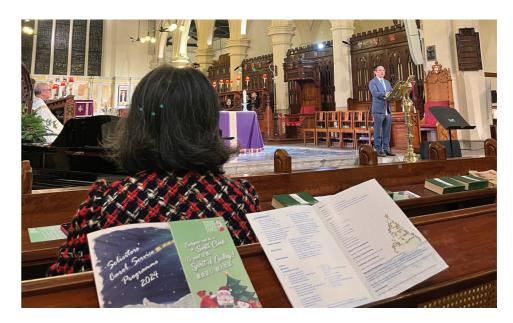
To mark the official start of the city-wide fundraising campaign, an inspiring opening ceremony, dedicated to celebrating the spirit of giving, was held at ArtisTree, in Taikoo Place, on November 12. The distinguished guests included Christine Wai Yee-yan, acting director of broadcasting of RTHK, and Paul Wong, general counsel and company secretary of the Post, who officiated at the ceremony. The OSC ambassadors, singer Jay Fung Wan-him and Paralympian Daniel Chan shared their inspiring stories of perseverance and generosity.

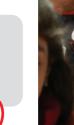

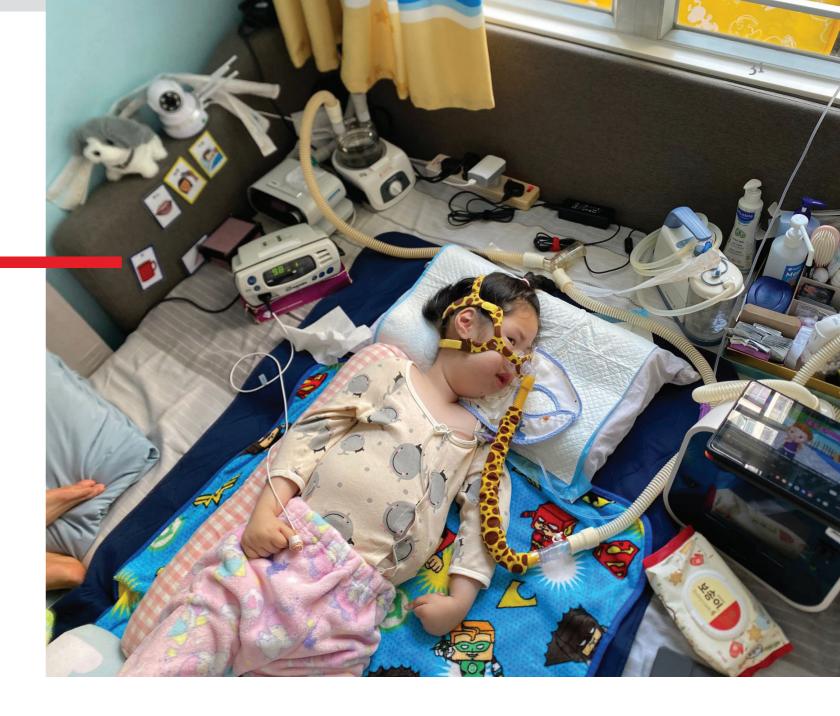

Journey of your donations: from fundraising to impact

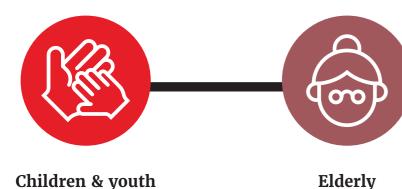
Building on the incredible support from our city-wide fundraising efforts, this chapter outlines the allocation and impact of those funds. Discover the newly funded charitable projects as they embark on their missions and witness the inspiring outcomes of our continuing projects, showcasing how the impact of your generosity fills the unmet needs in the underserved communities.

Each year, from June to August, we conduct an open call for proposals to select beneficiaries for OSC's fundraisers. Hong Kong-based non-profit charitable organisations are invited to apply, with priority to supporting smaller charities operating without much funding support from the government or other large patrons. Following a rigorous process – including standardised eligibility criteria, a review by our Selection Committee, and due diligence by the Hong Kong Council of Social Service – 11 projects that support underserved communities are being selected.

The OSC team remains committed to supporting these projects via funding disbursement and regular project monitoring and visits.

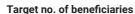

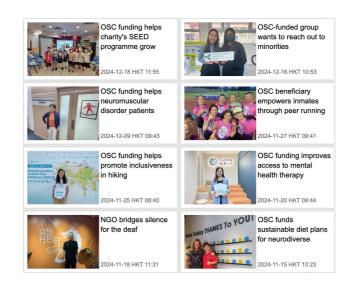


Impact powered by the Post's and RTHK's media platforms

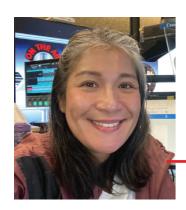

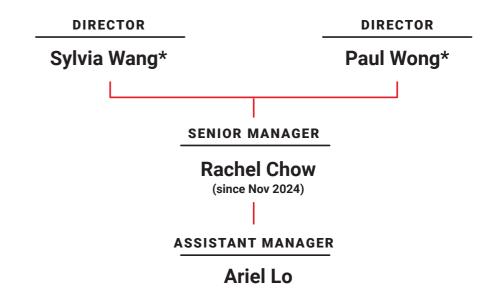

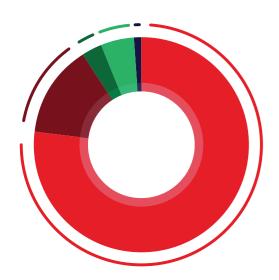
