





WHAT IS OPERATION SANTA CLAUS?

All good stories about gift giving begin at Christmas, and Operation Santa Claus is no different.

Its roots stretch back to the 1960s when RTHK Radio 3 presenters performed public stunts to raise money for charity, such as jumping into Victoria Harbour, climbing flagpoles and giving rooftop poetry recitals. In the 1970s, the government gave Hongkongers the Community Chest – an official body for receiving charitable donations – which all but put an end to charity fundraising at Christmas.

By the 1980s, worries about Hong Kong's future sparked a renewed interest in charity fundraising as a way of spreading optimism and positivity throughout society. And so, in 1988, Operation Santa Claus was born.

The first campaign set out to raise HK\$100,000. In 1989, the *South China Morning Post* began covering beneficiaries' stories every day throughout December which helped smash the campaign's total target of HK\$150,000 in the first week. Today, Operation Santa Claus has raised over HK\$230,000,000 for charitable causes since 1988, and has benefited some 214 worth projects. Now *that* is a tradition of gift giving that the people Hong Kong can be proud of.

OSC and its beneficiariesonce again thank Hong-kongers for their kindness

Held between 10 November 2014 and 21 January 2015, OSC 2014 marked the 27th time, the *South China Morning Post* (SCMP) and Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) have joined forces to persuade Hongkongers to share their good fortune with the needy. To date, OSC donors' kindness and compassion has succeeded in raising over HK\$230,000,000 for some 214 deserving projects.

Each year's OSC opening ceremony attracts an audience of high-profile benefactors. This year was no exception with VIP attendees at the 10 November kick-off event including leading Cantopop star and actress Corinna Chamberlain who also kindly served as OSC Ambassador at the Police Married Quarters in Central. Officiating guest at this year's ceremony was the HKSAR Government's Chief Secretary, Carrie Lam Cheng Yuet-ngor.

The glittering line up at OSC 2014's evening cocktails closing ceremony on 21 January 2015 at event sponsor Crown Wine Cellar's prestigious Deep Water Bay premises was equally impressive. Guest of honor this time around Executive Council member Anna Wu Hung Yuk.



A very successful year

OSC 2014 succeeded in raising a massive HK\$20,759,231 for its 20 beneficiaries. This was the second largest annual total in its 27-year history and only the second time funds raised have burst through the HK\$20,000,000 level. The sum raised included 28 major corporate donations of over HK\$150,000, plus contributions from 22 local schools.

The 10-week campaign involved over 40 donor events and attracted participants from across donating companies' staff, schools' students and indeed the local community at large. Along the way, OSC generated over 60 newspaper stories and 30 radio interviews via the SCMP, RTHK and other leading media channels.

OSC 2014 also Inspired Hong Kong Polytechnic University design students to pioneer an eye-catching "Small Change Big Change" ad campaign.

Gratifyingly, OSC 2014 succeeded in attracted more individual donations than in the previous year. In all, total contributions by individual donors surged from HK\$900,000 in 2013 to HK\$1,600,000 this time around. A measurable rise in funds collected by street fundraising teams was another major plus. In all, our volunteers were given the surprisingly large sum of about HK\$300,000 in small change coins via various donation boxes in retail outlets, plus donation booths at events like this year's Christmas fair and Candy Gram and OSC Santa Hat charity sale.

OSC 2014 broke further new ground and strengthened links with Non Government Organisations (NGOs) by hosting a leadership training programme for NGO executives. The resultant collaboration between OSC, the Chinese University of Hong Kong and UBS will inject around HK\$1,258,000 into a 10-month training course for NGO executives. The course will run from March to December 2015.

Held from 1 November to 31 December 2014, this second year of the MBA Charity Challenge attracted 15 MBA teams from seven local and overseas universities to go head on behalf of OSC and its beneficiaries. Participating teams devised, submitted and implemented sound business plans for the selling of Santa hats and other festive items to raise money for this year's various deserving causes.

Top Fundraiser was the V Care team from Manchester Business School who raised an extraordinary HK\$300,324 and won a dinner with the chief executive of Swire Properties. Also worthy of a mention are CityU's Team Hitchcock whose efforts contributed HK\$150,000 and were honoured with 2014's Best Business Plan Award. OSC has long been renowned for its across-the-board ability to attract and engage supporters, donors and participants of all genders, ages and income groups. OSC 2014 once again saw the SCMP and RTHK's well-oiled publicity machine succeed in measurably adding to public awareness of both beneficiary organisations and their projects. Specific examples of publicity included over 60 newspaper stories and 30 radio interviews in the SCMP, on RTHK and via various other leading media operators. Several prominent local celebrities also showed their enthusiastic support for the campaign, while online platforms such as the OSC 2014 website (osc.scmp.com) and Facebook page also played their part.

Celebrity Support

In 2014, OSC continued its long tradition of attracting leading local celebrities to volunteer time for itself and its beneficiaries free of charge. This time around those happily lending a helping hand to the OSC cause included leading local TV star Wong Cho Lam who filmed several fun videos performing mystifying magic tracks. The videos were subsequently uploaded to YouTube. Following the short performances, Wong Cho Lam urged viewers to try the tricks out on their friends. He concluded each spot by saying, "One doesn't need magic tricks to make a donation. So go ahead and donate to OSC." Local magician "Miss Hunny" also joined him in the coin challenge.

In her capacity as OSC 2014 Ambassador pop star Corinna Chamberlain performed at the opening ceremony and encouraged everyone to donate on social media. Hong Kong movie actress Cherry Ngan was another who joined the campaign and helped boost sales of OSC-branded Santa Claus hats in a series of adverts that ran in *Young Post* and *Cosmopolitan*.

OSC 2013's donors' generosity ultimately funded and benefitted some 18 charitable projects across the following five areas:

- · Children & Youth
- Community
- Elderly
- Medical
- Physical & Mental Disabilities

In May 2014, OSC 2013's deserving causes were subsequently awarded up to HK\$360,000 in extra funding to extend either their project's duration or reach.

Whilst still fairly new, all 18 beneficiaries' projects have already succeeded in using their additional funding to generate significant impact on people right across Hong Kong. Particular highlights include OSC-supported charity Sailability's sending of a team of para sailors to the 2014 Para Asia Games in Korea. The team eventually returned home with a bronze medal. Peggy, Maggie's Cancer Caring Centre

A mother's love lives forever in song

Peggy, now 34 years old, is a young lady who was diagnosed with stage III ovarian cancer in 2013, just several days before giving birth to her son. She has received various treatments and is now in palliative care. Peggy was well aware that she might leave this world any time and the only thing that she couldn't let go was that her son would lose the memory of his mother when he grows up.

With Maggie's staff's invitation, Peggy joined the Song Writing Programme, one of Maggie's Music Therapy programmes funded by Operation Santa Claus, to compose her own song and lyrics to express her feelings and words to her son. Her song was then recorded into a CD as a gift to her son.

Peggy expressed that "after I created the song, I felt so relived, released and comforted and, most importantly, connected with my son even in the future. I feel so grateful to Maggie's Centre and the funded programme which could help me cope effectively with the emotional challenges and distress during my cancer journey."

"Despite the fluctuations and near-death experiences, Peggy is determined to continue to stay at her best, especially with the hope to raise her son and with the continued support of Maggie's," says Ms May Cheng, Programme and Volunteer Development Manager of Maggie's Cancer Caring Centre.

Stepping on the road to recovery

Yu Lam is a cheerful girl aged 7 who is studying in Primary 1 at Ebenezer School in Hong Kong. She was diagnosed as cone rod dystrophy and global delay. Her visual ability was seriously affected with severe low vision, and she had obesity and flat feet.

With the OSC funding, physiotherapist offered Yu Lam weekly group training to improve her physical abilities. Individualised exercise therapy and training were prescribed to focus on correcting her recent problem of posture, balance, coordination and problem solving skills

"After 8 months of physiotherapy and gross motor training, Yu Lam has shown impressive improvement in balance and coordination. She walks up stairs or down stairs at a faster pace, more efficiently and more independently," said Jacky Leung Chun Keung, Physiotherapist. "Also, she is more active in participating in physical activities and more independent when solving problems during gross motor training and scenarios of daily orientation and mobility."

The brave boy who learnt to smile

When Yuantao joined Half the Sky's Infant Nurture programme in Guiyang as a one-year old baby, he was very weak. He could not raise his head, seldom smiled and always cried. Yuantao's nanny. Xiong Fang, tried to comfort him, but without success. Still, she persisted. Day after day, Xiong Fang held Yuantao close and spoke to him reassuringly. Slowly, Yuantao started to change. Yuantao followed his now beloved nanny with his eyes, wiggled his arms and feet excitedly when he saw her, learned to sit up and, best of all, started smiling!

"Thanks to Operation Santa Claus, all the nannies in Guiyang are better qualified to handle the challenges of their jobs. All the nannies have received training and taken a certification test to ensure they have absorbed the material. But the real proof is their patient nurturing of the 24 children at Half the Sky's Children's Center in Guiyang," says Carmen Lau, Director of Development of Half the Sky Foundation (Asia) Limited. "So much has changed for the children. There are new mats and shelves in the playroom, new toys and most important, new smiles and laughter."





Xiaolei, Chi Heng Foundation

Finding strength by supporting others

Xiaolei, 19 years old grew up in rural Henan. Despite disabilities in his legs, he had done well in school. However he learned that he had contracted HIV when he visited a doctor four years ago. When neighbours began distancing themselves, he lost all hope and even contemplated suicide.

"The Hero Book programme, sponsored by Operation Santa Claus, provided financial support to Xiaolei to emble him to continue his education and gave him a unique opportunity to rebuild his self-confidence through the Hero Book workshop," says Mr Leroy Lam, Operations Director of Chi Heng Foundation. "In the beginning, he kept to himself. With encouragement from facilitators and fellow students, he turned around and became a big brother to the younger students. He was the MC at the workshop is farewell celebration party."

Xiaolei now wants to be the founder of a company and have a family of his own. In his workshop feedback, he said, "The Hero Book workshop helped us realise our inner strength and rediscover our self-confidence. I am actually not weak at all. I feel good and I am very grateful!"

SECTION 7

A gratifying 26% rise in applications from potential beneficiaries

The call for proposals from potential OSC 2014 beneficiaries began on 3 June 2014 in ads in the SCMP and via website banner ads and eNewsletters from the Hong Kong Council of Social Services (HKCSS).

By the 7 July 2014 closing date, some 106 applications had been received. This figure represents a sizeable 26% rise over the 84 applications received the previous year.

The Selection Committee for OSC 2014 comprised eight representatives from five major local organisations: The SCMP (x2), RTHK (x2), OSC, various donors (x2) and the HKCSS.

Selection criteria for OSC 2014 included:

- Project themes
- · Project sustainability
- Economic feasibility
- · Number of beneficiaries
- Favoured material plan (with tangible items)
- Small organisations with less fundraising ability
- History of past OSC funding
- · Well managed organisation
- Transparency

20 charities across six areas (Children & Youth, Community, Environmental, Elderly, Medical Issues, and Physical & Mental Disabilities) were selected as being deserving of OSC 2014's support. Please see page 20-21 for details.

Project Monitoring

All beneficiaries of OSC campaigns are required to submit:

- In-depth project progress reports and presentations
- Detailed summaries of their past achievements and current financial

OSC staff will also regularly conduct site visits to beneficiaries and request information from beneficiaries' staff in order to monitor project progress.

UBS OSC NGO Leadership Programme

2014's establishment of the nine-month-long OSC UBS Leadership Training Programme (LTP) has enabled OSC to reach a whole new level. LTP staff support leaders from small and mid-size local NGOs subsequently work closely with the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) in developing their business management and financial skills. The NGOs are also shown how to more effectively build peer networks so as to maximise their resources and impact. Aside from providing funds, UBS and CUHK appoint staff to serve as mentors in areas such as financial control, management and marketing. The course will run from March to November 2015.

This year, OSC 2014's Selection Committee earmarked a total 24 NGOs and corporations from a total of 70 applications across the community service sector.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

OSC 2014 raised HK\$20,854,000 through donations, which is the second highest amount recorded during its 27-year history. The majority of this sum - some 80 per cent - came from corporate donations. Other sources of income included donations from the general public, bank interest and surplus rolled over from previous OSC campaigns, bringing the total amount to HK\$22,381,000.

Significantly, 2014 generated more individual donations than in previous years - a total of HK\$1,600,000 compared to HK\$900,000 in 2013 - an increase of around 80 per cent.


This year's campaign also attracted more donations from street fundraising - much of it in the form of small change dropped in collection boxes. Locations such as retail outlets, donation booths, Christmas fairs and this year's Candy Gram and Santa Hat charity sale contributed an additional HK\$300,000 to aid OSC's efforts on behalf of the disadvantaged.

As always, the SCMP and RTHK met essential costs such as transportation and postage and did everything possible to maintain minimal project administration and fundraising expenses at a level of around 4 per cent. Donations





Major climate change breakthrough as the two powerhouses agree on emissions ahead of next year's Paris conference

inced new targets for lp curb global climate

As part of the arrangement unced by the White House, the United States would cut net greenhouse gas emissions 26 to 28 per cent below 2005 levels in the next II years.

At the same time, President Xi Jinping (習近平) agreed that China for the first time would set a date when its emissions would hit a peak, after which it would begin cutting its use of fossil fuels.

According to the White House, China will aim to peak its carbon dioxide emissions "around 2030". trying to hit that target sooner. At the same time, China would work to increase the non-fossil fuel share of its energy use to 20 per cent by 2030.

China and the United States account for more than one-third of the world's greenhouse gas emissions. The deal is seen as a major breakthrough





Taliban attack kills 141 in Pakistan

Survivors recount the brutal details of the deadly massacre at an army-run school as world condemns 'act of terror'

yesterday at the news of 132 childr and at least nine staff being killed by jihadists at their school in Pakistan. Helen Wong, 15, from Shatin

College, said: "141 [people dead]. That's the number of students in my year group.

The attack began on Tuesday morning when seven Taliban gunmen, wearing suicide vests, attacked the Army Public School and Degree College in the north-west of the country. Students were gunned down and some female teachers were burned alive. During the eight-hour massacre 141 people were

killed, including school principal Tahira Qazi. A further 121 students were wounded, many critically,

One student who survived, Shahrukh Khan, 16, said he and his classmates were in a careers guidance session when four gunmen burst in. "Someone screamed at us to get down and hide below the desks," he said. "Then one of them



Shahrukh said he felt searing pain as he was shot in both his legs just below the knee. He pretended to be dead as he tried to hide from the gunmen.
"I folded my tie and pushed it into my mouth so

that I wouldn't scream," he said. "My body was shivering. I saw death so close ... I felt as though it was death that was approaching me."

He is currently recovering in a local hospital. Another student at the hospital, Hammad Ahmed, also survived the attack.

"I was with my friends ... when we heard gunshots," he said, "We rushed inside the classroom guisious, The sain. We tusine inside the classiform, our teacher closed the door, she was trying to lock it when the terrorists forced it open. All 10 of my classmates and our teacher died, only I survived."

The Pakistani Taliban, a militant group who want to overthrow the government, claimed responsibility for the attack. Meanwhile, Pakistani Nobel laureate Malala Yousafzai condemned the violence. Malala, 17 was shot by a Taliban gunman in Pakistan in 2012 for campaigning for female education.

"I am heartbroken by this senseless and coldblooded act of terror in Peshawar that is unfolding before us. Innocent children in their school have no place in horror such as this. I condemn these atrocious and cowardly acts," she said.

"I, along with millions of others around the world mourn these children, my brothers and sisters - but ve will never he defeated."

Smashed windows and arrests at Legco

As masked protesters cracked glass doors at the Legislative Council, protest organisers say they do not condone the violent acts



whom appeared to be teenagers, used metal barriers and other objects including broken bricks to try to crack open the glass doors outside the anteen at the Legco complex yesterday.

Student groups and pan-democratic politician distanced themselves from the violent clashes which took place at around 1am on Wednesday

Three police officers were hurt and four men have been arrested so far.

Scholarism convener Joshua Wong Chi-fung said he did not understand the rationale behind storming the Legco complex. He said in a civil disobedience campaign, participants have to shoulder their legal responsibilities and ensure the safety of other protesters. "I am not sure I would have been able to stop them if I was at the scene, I hope protesters will discuss things with us before they take action in the

oiscuss tinings with us before they take action in the future." he says. When asked if he thinks last night's violence will jeopardise the Occupy Central movement, Wong said no, and added that the government is to blame for the chaos. He also called for protesters to try to keep up the non-violent pledge of the movement.


